

### **Outside Gym - Brimmers Way**

The parish council has secured the majority of funding from the Aylesbury Community Board to install an outside fitness gym on Brimmers Way playpark. The equipment will include Street Workout, Proludic Urbanix Spinning Bicycle, Urbanix Spinning Bike, Elliptical Trainer, Proludic Urbanix Abs Bench, Proludic Urbanix Chin UP and Dip.



### Playparks refurbishment

Councillor James has been working on the refurbishment of our play parks. The parks will be renamed and have a theme such as a castle and a pirate ship. Some parks will have accent on activities for older children whilst some equipment such as swings will be relocated to places where they have been requested. Look out for further details in the next edition.

### **Allotment Competition**

We are pleased to confirm that the parish council is going to be running the allotment competition again this year. Every allotment will be judged by a panel of judges and the judging will take place between Monday 13th of June to Friday 1st of July. During this time period the judges will review every allotment based on the following criteria:

- 1. Plot cleanliness
- 2. Health and vigour of the planting
- 3. Maximising the use of space
- 4. Range of crops
- 5. Overall plot appearance

Every plot is going to be judged so you do not need to enter the competition. The



top three plots will be notified and receive a prize which will be given out at Fair in the Square on Saturday 9th of July at some point in the afternoon. The prizes this year have been donated by Hartwell Nurseries. We look forward to seeing all your lovely produce.

## Maintenance Update 2022

### **Grounds Maintenance update for May 2022**

- 1: The grass cutting has now started, we are starting to cut back the hedges and open up the bridges, doing this allows the timber to breathe and not stay damp and potentially rot. This autumn we will also start to open up some areas to allow views of the riverine when the residents walk around the village.
- 2: Winter bedding will soon be coming to an end, we hope you have enjoyed seeing them on your daily journeys, they will be replaced with the summer bedding in early June.
- **3:** Weed spraying is on-going, as and when the weather allows.
- **4:** Sadly we have noticed an increase in vandalism and graffiti, if you see

- anything that is damaged or tagged, please let us know, we will do our best to repair the damage, and remove the graffiti as soon as possible.
- **5:** All the parks have been inspected by ROSPA, and any major works have now been completed, new basketball nets have been put up, these will hopefully not get vandalised, so that everyone can enjoy the MUGA.
- **6:** We do try hard to keep the village tidy and free from litter and dog waste, but if you see anything that concerns you please do leave a message and we will try to help if we can.

# Reports presented at the Annual Parish Meeting for Coldharbour on Thursday7th April 2022

### Annual report for Coldharbour parish council presented by Cllr Andrew Cole, Chairman of Coldharbour parish council



The last year has continued to be an unusual and challenging one, but we are starting to see things getting back to a more normal way of life. In May we had the elections which had been delayed by 12 months due to the pandemic, this saw the election of our 3 new Buckinghamshire Unitary Council Councilors Steven Lambert, Adam Poland-Goodyer and Sarah James. Both Adam and Sarah are new to their role as a County Councillor but have served for quite some time on our parish council and have been highly active within the community so I know they will be making sure our residents' voices are heard at county level.

Considering Adam's additional workload as a unitary councilor, he decided to step back from being Chairman of the parish council and I was delighted to be asked again to take on the role of Chairman. As I said at the beginning of this report, we are seeing glimpses of returning to some sort of normality and I was delighted to be able to attend the Parish Remembrance Service with residents and fellow councilors. In December I attended the Mayors Christmas Carol Service at St Mary's Church. We were also able to put on our first community event for nearly two years. Christmas in the Square was a huge success and, although a bit damp, it was nice

to see so many residents attending the event to welcome Father Christmas to the village, our singing was a little rusty, but it really started to feel normal again. Looking forward, plans are already in place for the Queen's Jubilee celebrations as well as hosting our annual community events through the summer.

At the December meeting of the council I had the privilege of awarding Steven Lambert an Honorary Freeman of the Parish. This is the highest honor a parish council can bestow and was awarded in recognition of his long service to our community. We also said goodbye to Chloe Lambert (no relation) who has been covering our meetings, as a local newspaper reporter, on behalf of the Bucks Herald for as long as I can remember. She had decided to reduce some of her commitments and I hope she enjoys the rest.

The parish council has continued to work on behalf of its residents addressing local concerns and managing the large land areas and responsibilities we have for Fairford Leys. We continue to meet monthly with representatives from HS2 and its contractors EKFB raising concerns over traffic, flooding, environmental and noise. We also had some success preserving a number of ancient oaks which were brought to our attention by residents. Following pressure by both the council and the community we were able to get the compound moved slightly to preserve them.

We have returned to "face to face" meetings and continue to carry out our responsibilities as a parish council by being consulted on planning applications, managing the existing

land areas and taking on further land and responsibilities within the riverine corridor. As well as HS2, we have dealt with issues raised directly by our residents affecting our environment.

I would like to thank Keith Gray, Clerk to the parish council, for his continued support and guidance, Andy Barnett, Community Centre Manager and our community centre staff who have continued to keep the centre Covid safe and open as much as possible during those difficult times. Our fabulous, dedicated and committed, maintenance team, Steve Webb, Steve Baughan and Bennie Orlandi, continue to be complemented on the amazing work they do keeping the village looking great. And lastly to my fellow councilors who willingly give their own time to help make Fairford Leys such a wonderful place to live and work.

Our aim, as always, is to continue to keep Fairford Leys the best it can possibly be, support our residents and local businesses and represent the interests of the parish as strongly as possible.

It is my privilege to present this report, we continue to meet every first Thursday at the community centre, and we encourage residents to attend and see the work that Coldharbour parish council carries out.

# Annual Reports - continued

### Report for Annual Parish Meeting Prepared by Buckinghamshire Cllr Adam Poland-Goodyer and Cllr Sarah James, Buckinghamshire Councilors for Aylesbury West



We were delighted to have been elected to serve as your local councilors at Buckinghamshire Council, the new unitary authority replacing Buckinghamshire County Council in 2020. Due to Covid, the first elections were held in 2021.

This has been a year of new experiences and rapid learning curves for us as new members of Buckinghamshire Council. There was a very thorough induction, but we are still learning who the go-to people are in order to get things done in our community. Being both a parish and unitary councilor brings benefits to our community as we are rooted here, and it is always at the forefront of our activities. We are bringing to the role between us over 10 years' experience at a parish level.

We have represented the parish at various meetings and civic events throughout the year including the Aylesbury Community board meetings. Cllr James successfully ran a trial project of play streets in Napier Road and organised the funding via the Community Board for a new projector and screen for our 'in the square' events.

For the community Cllr Poland-Goodyer has facilitated and succeeded in funding a new adult gym for Fairford Leys as part of the playpark's regeneration

being led by Cllr Sarah James. We have liaised and installed better, new, clearer road signage for Brimmers Way, and been working with the Adept project to sort out the lighting issues in Brimmers Way and bashing heads together to get the land transfer of the riverine corridor completed.

We have got local roads and drains cleared (particularly the roundabout of Coldharbour way and Arncott way) and we should soon have double yellow lines in Arncott Way to prevent dangerous parking. We are in conversation about the state of the footpaths on Brimmers Way and in liaison with the Ernest Cook Trust, HS2 and Aylesbury Town Council to mitigate against the HS2 works and gain whatever benefits we can for our community.

We are continually chasing HS2 for information on the changes to our riverine corridors due to HS2 working in Wendover. We are also meeting with representatives of the River Thame Conservation trust to better understand the watercourses across Fairford Leys. We have been chasing HS2 up on their continued works on the Oxford Road and in March Cllr Adam Poland-Goodyer (in his role as shadow TECC cabinet member) managed to get HS2 to publicly commit to building an over bridge on the Oxford Road this year.

Cllr Sarah James has been assisting residents with unsuitable housing conditions and access to Covid recovery grants as well as questioning the head of Buckinghamshire's Children's services on the result of their latest Ofsted report.

After a question at a full council meeting, we managed to arrange a meeting between the cabinet member for Children's services, the head of Children's services and ourselves, and



the chairman of Coldharbour Parish Council about the running of the Children's homes in Fairford Leys by Benjamin UK. We raised our concerns and voiced experiences of residents. The cabinet member was visibly shocked at what residents have had to endure due to the poor management of these homes.

We helped in the design and consultation phase of the new Emerald Way cycle path restructuring and alignment, creating a traffic-free, safer route for residents to cycle or walk into Aylesbury Town centre or to Waddesdon Manor via the Greenway. With HS2 causing more chaos in the years ahead, this might be a useful route to have.

We will continue to represent our ward of Aylesbury West and the residents of Fairford Leys at all future meetings of Buckinghamshire Council and we will continue to unequivocally support Coldharbour Parish Council and its Chairman. 

### Fairford Leys WI

Please let me introduce myself, I have the great honour of being Fairford Leys WI Madam President since October 2021. I took over from the lovely Jane Rice who sailed us through the dark days of Covid19, keeping us together with a series of treats including cream teas and pretty pot plants all delivered to our doors, at a distance of course. But the most important thing was human contact - a phone call, a zoom call, just, how are you doing? We came out the other end all intact and knowing that there was always somebody there!

My story at FLWI started some 17 years ago when at 47 I was widowed and my friends decided I needed something to occupy myself. I was running a business, caring for four
