PRESENTATION:

Cllr Richard Lloyd - Aylesbury Town Council

To give a presentation to CPC on the proposal for a Community Hub / Centre building to be established on the old golf course premises on Fairford Leys.

Cllr Lloyd gave a presentation and answered questions from parish councillors and residents, on the proposal. He also copied councillors into the presentation slides with additional information and offered to answer any further questions outside the meeting.

- * AADT stands for Annual Average Daily Traffic flow, and is the generally accepted method of comparing traffic flows on roads. In its simplest form, it is the total traffic flow over a year in both directions divided by 365
- **The 85th percentile speed is defined as, "the speed at or below which 85 percent of all vehicles are observed to travel under free-flowing conditions past a monitored point."
 - Cllr Poland reported on meetings that he, Cllr Cole, Cllr James, and the Clerk had attended with Hs2 representatives. Tree planting is taking place as agreed with Hs2 to help shield Fairford Leys from the train line and help limit noise from the track. Over 2,300 trees are being planted along the stretch of land bordering the train line area. Further meetings are to take place to ensure mitigation and updates are received in respect of the Fairford Leys community.
